## **CAREER PATH OPTIONS**

- With **34 colleges** and **80+ programs** leading to **hundreds of career paths**, Washington's community and technical colleges are the perfect places to jumpstart a new career or take your current job to the next level.
- You have options: our colleges offer industry-standard certificates so you can go out and earn a good living
  right away and return to school while you work to keep increasing your skills and your pay rate.
- · You can build up to an associate degree and even find an apprenticeship so you can earn while you learn.
- What you learn in classes leads straight to in-demand job skills. We work hand-in-hand with our industry
  partners to make sure our students become top job candidates.

#### **EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

At Washington's community and technical colleges, choose from many career paths that lead to higher paychecks. Below are just a few examples:

#### HEALTH

- Cardiovascular Technologists and Technicians secure a yearly average of \$66,920.
   Plus, demand is soaring in the state at 20%.
- Registered Nurses command \$91,310, and this recession-proof career is growing at a staggering 20%.

#### **STEM**

• Industrial Engineering Technicians earn an average of \$71,920. And in Washington State, demand is surging at double the national average!

#### **LOGISTICS**

• Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers command a sizable \$54,320 a year, and demand in the state is moving at more than double the national average.

#### **MANUFACTURING**

• Machinists manufacture a respectable \$55,930 a year. Plus, the need for these skilled workers is booming at 8% in the state, double the national average.

#### **AUTOMOTIVE**

- Automotive Service Technicians and Mechanics gear up at \$54,320 a year, and the trade is growing steadily at 2%.

#### SUPPORT PROGRAMS

- Worker Retraining Program: For those on unemployment, students are eligible for tuition assistance, job search assistance, and other benefits.
- Basic Food Employment and Training (BFET) Program: Students who receive
  food assistance/food stamps may be eligible for help with job training. The program
  offers tuition assistance, career counseling, childcare support, job search help, and much more.

### **FINANCIAL AID**

- You won't know until you apply: In the 2019-20 academic year alone, 39% of Washington's community and technical college students received need-based financial aid.
- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) determines students' eligibility for federal funding. For U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens.
- The WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) is an alternative to the FAFSA for those who are not eligible for federal funding, such as undocumented students, DREAMers, and those who have defaulted on a federal loan. It is free, confidential, and private.
- The Ability to Benefit (ATB) provision of the FAFSA allows those enrolled in Title IV eligible programs who
  do not have a high school diploma or equivalent to still qualify for federal aid while pursuing high school
  and college degrees.
- The Washington College Grant can help students of all ages earn certificates, degrees, or even land paying apprenticeships. As of 2020-21, more low- and middle-income families now qualify.
   For full- and part-time students.
- The Opportunity Grant helps low-income students complete up to one year of college and a certificate
  in a high-wage, high-demand career. They can get help with tuition, fees, and books, plus be eligible
  to receive emergency childcare, work with an industry mentor, and more.
