Introduction

The Image/Upgrade Overview Document is intended to provide ctcLink users with a summary of the accessibility changes that will be made in the system due to the upcoming image or PeopleTools upgrade implementation.

Oracle releases multiple PeopleSoft updates, called Images, for each pillar every year. Each Image contains bug fixes and features that are important for PeopleSoft to work well. PeopleTools upgrades update the underlying framework of the system. There are minimal changes that are noticeable to the end users.


Below is an overview of the changes you can expect to see as part of this upgrade.

Fixed: Button is disabled but its state is not read by screen reader

Problem: Disabled save button on My Preferences page is read as enabled by screen reader.

Navigation

Banner Region > Actions Menu > My Preferences Submenu



On My Preferences Page, the Save button remains "disabled" when there are no changes on the page.

It becomes "enabled" when user makes changes on the page. Prior to Tools 8.59.21, the Save button in "disabled" state was announced as "enabled." This issue was fixed in 8.59.21.

Accessibility Properties: Save Button States



Prior to 8.59.21 the Accessibility Properties of state of "disabled" Save button were "enabled, sensitive" indicating to the user that the button is "enabled and clickable."

After 8.59.21 the state of "disabled" save button is correctly marked as "unavailable."
