The work plan serves a multifaceted purpose, aiming to facilitate your college in reflecting on current achievements, identifying opportunities for growth, and planning activities for the 2024-2026 period. Furthermore, this tool will play a pivotal role in shaping the peer and professional development learning agenda for upcoming statewide events, coaching sessions, and additional technical assistance initiatives. It is designed to foster connections between colleges based on shared priorities and reaffirm your college's dedication to implementing Guided Pathways with fidelity.

Each Section of the work plan is arranged to comply with legislative requirements from the Workforce Education and Investment Act, the legislative action that provides the system with Guided Pathways Funding. The sections are further aligned with questions from the 2022 Scale of Adoption Survey, administered by the Community College Research Center. Each college received a copy of an individualized plan that is populated with college responses from the survey.
